How to Apply for Financial Aid:

- 1 Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid at www.fafsa.gov.** Students applying for Spring 2021 should submit the 2020-2021 form. You will need your 2019 Federal Tax Return. All students will need their FSA ID (<https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm>) and Averett University's School Code (003702). Graduate students are considered independent for financial aid purposes.
- 2 Review your Student Aid Report (SAR) for accuracy.** You will receive this form 7-10 days after the FAFSA is submitted. If there are any errors on your SAR, log back into your FAFSA to make corrections.
- 3 Review your Award Letter at NetPartner once you have been registered for classes.** This lists the financial aid that you qualify for. If you wish to decline all or a portion of the award, log into NetPartner to make any adjustments. Be sure to contact the Financial Aid Office if you have any questions about your award.
- 4 Complete Loan Entrance Counseling and the Master Promissory Note.** Both can be completed at www.studentloans.gov (you will need your FSA ID from Step 1).

Federal Loan Requirements

To be eligible to borrow funds under the Federal Direct Loan Program, you must:

1. File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
2. Be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident
3. Not be in default on prior educational loans
4. Maintain satisfactory academic progress

The Federal (Title One) Teacher Loan Forgiveness Program

If you and your school qualify, this program may provide loan forgiveness for eligible Federal Direct Loans. This is a separate program requiring separate forms and processes. The U.S. Department of Education will determine your eligibility for this program; Averett University is not responsible to verify your eligibility for this program. Please do not base your enrollment on this program, as it can be difficult to ensure qualification for government programs which are subject to reform and funding changes. **You must call 1-800-4-FED-AID to verify your eligibility or visit <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/repay-loans/forgiveness-cancellation/teacher> for an application.**

The TEACH Grant:

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program provides up to \$4,000 a year in grant assistance to students who are completing coursework towards certain high-need fields. In order to be eligible for a grant, a student must submit a FAFSA form and sign an Agreement to Serve as a full-time teacher at certain low-income schools and within certain high-need fields for at least four academic years within eight years after completing (or ceasing enrollment in) the course of study for which the candidate received a grant. The U.S. Department of Education and Student Financial Services Office will determine your eligibility for this program. The TEACH Grant converts to an unsubsidized Direct Loan if the student fails to complete any part of his or her obligation. This loan must be repaid. IMPORTANT:

If you are using financial aid to pay for tuition, you must be enrolled and fully admitted to the program of your choice before your student loan funds can be released. You may be required to make payments until your financial aid funds are released.



The Pay-As-You-Go option can be combined with financial aid in order to reduce your total student loan balance. See Page 7. Tuition payments are due two weeks prior to the start of each course.

Through this core, the graduate program provides both theoretical and practical experiences for teachers who wish to become leaders in their profession and strengthen their understanding of the teaching and learning process.

How you learn:

Online Format: The M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction Program is presented in an online, cohort-based format. You will take classes at your own pace in six-week blocks to allow intense study of each concept, and can graduate in approximately 20 months. No face-to-face meetings are required.

Students will have the option to accelerate their program, which can be completed in as little as approximately 15 months.

The M.Ed. In Administration and Supervision is presented online over 20 months in an accelerated format. You'll take classes one at a time in 8 week blocks to allow intense study of each concept.

The degree program requires a total of 320 internship hours on the elementary, secondary, and central office levels; 120 of which are embedded in coursework. Students will be required to participate in Zoom conferences with the university supervisor.

Experienced, licensed teachers seeking to learn the instructional assessment and behavior management skills needed to help students with disabilities or special needs reach their full potential.

What you learn:

The mission of Averett University is to prepare students to serve and lead as catalysts for positive change. Averett fulfills this mission by educating students from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and nations through liberal arts-based undergraduate and graduate programs in a personal, collegial, interdisciplinary environment. Graduates of this program will be equipped to assess special needs students and apply appropriate instructional strategies to help them meet educational goals. Students will engage in critical analysis of current research in special education and pursue in-person coached field experiences at local schools.

How you learn:

Online Format: The M.Ed. in Special Education K-12 Endorsement Track is presented in an accelerated cohort based format that allows you to earn your Special Education Endorsement over 24, 28 or 32 months*. You'll take no more than two classes at a time in six- to 12-week blocks for intense study of each concept. Small classes allow productive discussions, participation in projects and personal attention from your instructor. You will have local field experiences embedded in the coursework throughout the program. Students will be required to meet online with the university supervisor.

Career Outcomes:

Upon completion of this program, students will have earned an M.Ed. in Special Education and be eligible to add a K-12 Endorsement in the area of Special Education to his/her VA teaching license.

This program is designed for individuals seeking to learn the instructional assessment and behavior management skills needed to help students with disabilities or special needs reach their full potential.

What you learn:

The mission of Averett University is to prepare students to serve and lead as catalysts for positive change. Averett fulfills this mission by educating students from diverse backgrounds, cultures, and nations through liberal arts-based undergraduate and graduate programs in a personal, collegial, interdisciplinary environment. Graduates of this program will be equipped to assess special needs students and apply appropriate instructional strategies to help them meet educational goals. Students will engage in critical analysis of current research in special education. Your field experiences and student teaching placement will be directly supervised by Averett faculty, who all have years of experience in K-12 classrooms.

How you learn:

Online Format: The M.Ed. in Special Education K-12 Licensure Track is presented in an accelerated, cohort-based format that allows you to earn your teacher certification over 24, 28 or 32 months*. You'll take classes no more than two at a time in six- to 12-week blocks for intense study of each concept. Small classes accommodate productive discussions, participation in projects and personal attention from your instructor. You will be required to complete field experience hours and a student teaching placement in order to earn your VA teacher certification in the area of Special Education. Students will be required to meet online with the university supervisor.

Career Outcomes:

Upon completion of this program, students will have earned an M.Ed. in Special Education. Upon successful completion of the required licensure exams (including the VCLA Exam, the RVE Exam, the Praxis Subject Assessments (if applicable), graduates will be eligible for initial teaching licensure in the area of Special Education for grades K-12.

*The 24 month option is available to students starting in a spring semester only.

Students will be required to complete a full-time student teaching placement under the supervision of Averett faculty in order to be eligible for certification.

Transferring Credits

In the graduate programs, Averett will accept a maximum of 6 hours of graduate course work completed at another institution prior to matriculation at Averett University. All transfer credit must have been earned in an accredited graduate program and must parallel the curriculum at Averett. Credit must have been earned within three years immediately preceding the student’s request for transfer credit and carry a graduate grade of “B” or higher. Responsibility for the presentation of information that will satisfy these requirements for transfer of credit lies with the student.

Cohort Information, Registration, and Refund Policies

Class size is limited to 15 students and a minimum number of student enrollments is required to begin an online cohort.

Students must report a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Students enrolling in the online graduate programs will work closely with their student services representative to register for their classes throughout their program, and to determine if acceleration is possible.

Textbooks are required and can be purchased or rented at AU’s Bookstore.
